TIPS FOR ENJOYING THE PLANT SALE

1. Fill out the door prize/sign up form and put it in the box provided by the entrance door. This gives you a chance to win some wonderful prizes. We will announce winners during the Sale. Listen for PA system announcements and check the board as you exit for your name. We use the form to notify you of next year's sale. (We do not sell or give your contact information to anyone else.)
2. Remember there is a bakery table in the lobby that has coffee and assorted bake goods for sale. Also, sample the lovely teas and learn how to make them.
3. If you remember, bring a basket or wagon to collect your plants. A laundry basket works well. We are short on boxes this year. But if you didn't, pick up a cardboard flat(s) for your plants. You will find them on your right as you enter the gym. When you have filled up your flats and you still want to shop, you can "park" your plants in the Plant Parking area near the check-out lines. Remember to pick them up as you check out.
4. **Please do not remove the colored plastic stakes from the pots.**
5. Here is a general guide to the types of plants on each table. On the plant list, the first column lists the table where the plant can be found.

7. Wonderful gardening items are in our Garden Shoppe. Do you have a gardener on your birthday list?
8. Got questions about growing plants? Talk to any of our knowledgeable Ozaukee Master Gardeners today or contact Ask a Master Gardener by phone (262-284-8288) or online at www.ozaukeemastergardeners.org/questions/
9. Ready to check-out? If you have fewer than 10 items and will pay with cash, use the Express/Cash Only Lanes. If you are using a credit card, use the Credit Card Lanes. The other lanes take checks and cash.
10. If you are writing a check, make your check out to Ozaukee Master Gardeners or OMG.
11. When you get home, introduce your new plants gradually to the outside. Put them in the shade for a few hours each day, bringing them indoors each night. Gradually expose the plant to morning sun. After 7 to 10 days, your plants will be ready to transplant. Try to pick a cloudy day to transplant. Remember to water well.

Any adult (18 years or older) can participate in the Master Gardener program. No previous experience or training is necessary, although many people do have horticulture or gardening experience.
